April 2021

- 8 Indigenous Clean Energy 'Day in the Life' Film Series: Regional Chief Adamek filmed a segment for the Indigenous Clean Energy 'Day in the Life' Film Series to highlight her role and the work of the AFN YT Regional Office. The film series aims to uplift and empower Indigenous youth as future leaders and change makers in the clean energy sector.
- 8 Visit to Whitehorse Individual Learning Centre: Regional Chief Adamek and the AFN Yukon Regional Climate Change Coordinator brought pizza lunch for the students and staff at the Individual Learning Center (ILC) and shared highlights of the AFN Yukon Regional Office, the role of the Regional Chief as well as reflections on navigating high school, graduation and opportunities for the future. Emily shared about the YFN Climate Action Fellowship and other exciting climate initiatives.
- 12 Net Zero Advisory Body (NZAB) Meeting (Video-conference): Regional Chief Adamek and Regional Climate Coordinator met virtually with AFN National environment team discuss her invitation to participate as a member to Minister Wilkinson's Federal Net Zero Advisory Body. This independent group of experts has a mandate to engage with Canadians and provide advice to the Minister on pathways to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.
- **13-15** ACE Strategic Planning Sessions (Video-conference): Regional Chief Adamek, Regional Climate Coordinator and members of the ACE committee participated in a two-day strategic planning session to identify priority areas and opportunities for continued momentum and progress on climate action and the environment from coast-to-coast.
- **15-18 YFN Climate Action Fellowship 1st Gathering (Marsh Lake, YT):** The YFN Climate Action Fellowship safely gathered for the first time in person at Marsh Lake in Southern Yukon to come together in circle to connect, listen and share with one another. Regional Chief Adamek, respected Elders and climate experts joined the youth fellows over the three-day emergent retreat to share art, stories and reflections on climate action and the path ahead.
- 19 COP 26 Planning Meeting with Indigenous Clean Energy (Video-conference): Regional Chief Adamek, Regional Climate Coordinator and AFN staff Graeme Reed met virtually with Indigenous Clean Energy staff to discuss the opportunity of collaborating on a session for the upcoming COP26 in Glasgow, Scotland.
- 21 Presentation to FH Collins High School Social Justice Club: Regional Chief Adamek and Regional Climate Coordinator met with the FH Collins Secondary School Social Justice Club to share about the work of the Regional Chief, the AFN Yukon Regional Office and climate initiatives in advance of Earth Day.
- 22 Earth Day Walk with FH Collins Social Justice Club: Regional Chief Adamek and AFN YT Team Members joined the FH Collins High School Social Justice Club on Earth Day for an afternoon walk outdoors around the Millennium Trail, along the Yukon River in downtown Whitehorse. Students painted rocks and took photos of the scenery to acknowledge and celebrate the beauty of planet Earth.

- 5 **Community Visit to Kluane First Nation:** Regional Chief Adamek visited Kluane First Nation and Kluane Lake School to meet with students, Chief, and Council.
- **6-7 Community Visit to White River First Nation:** Regional Chief Adamek visited White River First Nation to meet with community leadership including newly elected Chief Chasse.

- 23 Prep Meeting for Upcoming FPT Minister's Meeting on Conservation, Wildlife and Biodiversity (Videoconference): Regional Chief Adamek, Regional Climate Coordinator and AFN Environment Staff Curtis Scurr & Ben Green-Stacy held a prep meeting in advance of the FPT Minister's Meeting on Conservation, Wildlife and Biodiversity to discuss key messages and priorities.
