The Indigenous Youth Policy School brings together inspiring Indigenous youth looking to learn more about how to engage with and impact policies in Canada.
- 27-28 Addressing Anti-Indigenous Racism in the Health Care System: National meeting focusing on engaging federal, provincial, and territorial governments, health system and First Nations, Inuit and Métis Nation partners such that all participants move towards eliminating anti-Indigenous racism within their respective areas of responsibility.
- 27 CYFN Leadership Meeting (Video-conference): Regional Chief Adamek and regional staff attended the Council of Yukon First Nations leadership meeting to participate in the updates and discussion regarding priority items for Yukon First Nations.

- Discussion on the Clean Growth Economy (Video-conference): Regional Chief Adamek and AFN YT RCCC joined the pre-budget consultation with Federal Ministers Fortier and Wilkinson to discuss visions and ideas as part of the pre-budget consultation process for Canada's Clean Growth Economy.

YFN's award winners included the First Nation of Na-Cho Nyak Dun's Indigenous Food Sovereignty Hub and Norma Kassi's partner project 'Youth Training in Ethical Knowledge Sharing and Co-Production to Advance Northern Indigenous-Led Conversation and Stewardship'.

- Yukon Climate Change Adaptation Forum (Virtual): Regional Chief Adamek provided a keynote presentation and opening address for the first session of the event titled 'Adaptation, Resilience and Why it Matters'. Chief Tizya-Tramm provided a keynote presentation for the fifth session titled 'Exploring Relationships between Food, Land, Water and Health'. AFN YT RCCC registered for sessions 1, 4 and 5 and observed various panels and participated in breakout sessions / discussions.
