A Look Back

July 2024

- 8-12 Assembly of First Nations Annual General Assembly (Montreal, QC): Regional Chief Adamek led a delegation of Yukon First Nations Youth, Chiefs, Elders, and leaders at the AFN AGA, meeting with First Nations leaders from across the country to set strategic direction based on regional and collective needs and priorities. The Chiefs in Assembly provided the AFN Executive with strategic direction through discussing and voting on several resolutions.
- AFN Yukon Region—BCAFN Clean Water Act (Bill C-61) Update Meeting: The AFN Yukon Region and BCAFN co-hosted a virtual meeting and info session to update Chiefs, leadership, and technicians on the First Nations Clean Water Act (C-61) which is currently in the Committee stage in the House of Commons. The meeting shared key updates with leadership, including BCAFN's legal analysis, and sought feedback on the draft bill to inform next steps for advocacy in the parliamentary process.
- AFN Yukon Region—CYFN (Whitehorse, YT): Regional Chief Adamek and members of the AFN Yukon Office and Grand Chief Johnston and members of the CYFN Executive Council Office met to discuss the reunification file
- IFPT on the Status of Women (Winnipeg, MB): Federal, Provincial, and Territorial Ministers Responsible for the Status of Women held their 42nd annual meeting. Ministers discussed best practices and discussed innovative approaches to ending gender-based violence, including involving men and boys, addressing misogyny and promoting positive masculinity.



- 25-29 Moosehide Gathering (Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Traditional Territory): AFN Yukon Elders and Council Members attended this year's Moosehide Gathering on Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in territory to share and celebrate culture, enjoy performances, share meals, dancing, drumming, singing and more.
- Meeting with ISC on FNCFS Program (Virtual): Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) requested to meet with Regional Chief Adamek to discuss and seek guidance in developing an approach to engage directly with YFN leadership on the implementation of the Reformed First Nations Child and Family Services (FNCFS) Program to complement any AFN planned engagement on the Final Agreement.
- 30-1 CYFN General Assembly (TKC Fish Camp): Members of the AFN Yukon Region team joined the CYFN General Assembly to share regional office updates and information about engagements on the Final Settlement Agreement (FSA)and the advancement of the long-term vision of the AFN Yukon Regional Office and working in collaboration with CYFN.
